

# What to Expect During the Procedure

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## The Consultation/First Appointment



In-depth consultations take place prior to any procedure. During this time, Jill assesses your skin type and your expectations of microblading. She will also go over any forms and other documentation needed in order to perform the service.

It is encouraged to bring along any pencils or other products you use to fill in your eyebrows so she can see the color you like. Pictures of yourself with your eyebrows drawn in or pictures of what you are hoping to achieve help to determine what your expected outcome is.

## The Procedure/Second Appointment



Jill will gather all necessary documentation and signatures prior to performing any work and take "before" photos. She will then review your eyebrow goals as discussed in the consultation. After that, Jill will draw on your eyebrows using a China Pencil, adjusting and modifying as needed. This can be the most time consuming part to ensure everything is symmetrical. Once finished, she will have you review the shape, arch, and size for your consent. From there, she will prepare the pigment color for your authorization. No micro blading starts until you have approved all four of these areas.

At that time, Jill will do what is called "stippling" to slightly break open the skin. She will then apply a topical anesthetic and numbing cream to prepare your skin, (stippling allows the cream to get into your skin for better comfort). After 15-20 minutes, she will perform the microblading process. During the process, re-application of the anesthetic will be applied to keep you comfortable. Permanent makeup pigment is used which is different than body art ink.

Once finished, after-care cream will be applied and Jill will review after-care instructions with you. You will also schedule your 8-12 week follow-up at that time.

## The Follow-Up/Third Appointment



The touch-up appointment is absolutely necessary, as Jill reviews the retention of the pigment from your procedure. During this appointment, color can be enhanced if needed and additional hairstrokes can be applied. Jill will sometimes be more conservative during the first appointment because more detail can always be added after the eyebrows have healed. This appointment is not as lengthy as the first procedure.
