

Aftercare Instructions for Eyeliner



After your Permanent Makeup Eyeliner appointment:

- Do not put anything at all on tattooed area other than what's given as part of your aftercare instructions. This includes antibiotic ointment.
- Avoid sweating for 1 week after service.
- Stay out of chlorinated pools, tanning beds for at least 1 week
- Use q-tip to apply small amount of ointment provided as a water barrier before and after you shower.
- Replace existing mascara and only use a brand new tube after having eyeliner done. There is too much bacteria in used makeup; this includes not using an eyelash curler for 2 weeks.
- Although rare, your eyes could become red from the eyeliner procedure. You can use emergency eyewash that can be purchased at any drug store. Eyewash that contains boric acid works well.
- Although uncommon, you could develop a sty if aftercare is not followed. Warm compresses typically take care of it, but you may need to contact your doctor if you feel it is not getting better.
- If eyes become infected, call your physician and obtain a prescription for eye drops.

Avoid for the 1st week after your appointment:

- Facial cleansers and water on pigmented areas
- Chlorine pools
- Retin-A on pigmented areas
- Makeup on pigmented area for 5 days (including non-allergenic)
- Hot, steamy, long showers
- Sun on pigmented areas
- Jacuzzi or saunas
- Terry towels on pigmented areas
- Shower with your back to the water to avoid water, shampoo and conditioner from getting into the pigmented areas.

Do not be alarmed by fading after the first application. The final color cannot be determined until at least 3 weeks after the touchup application is completed. This is the reason follow-ups are required. Botox should be performed no sooner than 2 weeks prior to your procedure and not again for 2 weeks after.
